*A Special Thank You to Ann Hamilton: As many of you know, Ann is stepping back from many of her activities due to age and health. I am sure that along with not being able to attend Mass as frequently as she would like, this is a great sacrifice for her. God, in His paradoxical ways, gives us the strength to do His work, and then takes that strength away from us as He chooses. **MARY THE MOTHER OF GOD: THE DIVINE MATERNITY:** I think that this is one of the most misunderstood privileges among non-Catholics. They seem to think that we believe that Mary "created Jesus". No human being creates another person, most especially God. We refer to parents as co-creators because God creates WITH them, but it is always God Who is the Creator of our immortal souls out of nothing.

A mother receives life into her womb that comes from God through the human father. As we know, the conception of Jesus is the ONE time that a MAN was conceived directly from our Heavenly Father without the assistance of a human father. In this sense, Mary is exactly like every other human mother.

But there was a previous grace, most especially the Immaculate Conception which prepared her to be the sinless Mother of God. Her heart was thus prepared to receive the Word of God before she conceived Him in her womb. This is why Mary was able to respond immediately to the angel Gabriel when he explained that the Holy Spirit would overshadow her and Jesus would be conceived in her womb.

To think that Jesus began His life in the same manner as every other human is a remarkable fact that begins to open our hearts to the great humility of God.

It also explains to us why Mary has been given the titles: Mother of the Church and Mother of us all.
