Three interesting Saints

I always encourage Catholics, especially young people, to read the lives of the saints and to look for those who are not so well-known. The lives you will find are much more interesting than today's celebrities, even if you know only one story in their biographies. Below are three examples about which I speak.



St. Tarcisius was an acolyte or perhaps a deacon at Rome. He was accosted and beaten to death on the Appian Way by a mob while carrying the Eucharist to some Christians in prison. The incident is included in Cardinal Wiseman's novel "Fabiola", and Pope Damasus wrote a poem about it. Tarsicius is the patron of first communicants and his feast day is August 15

St. Drihelm was a wealthy man of Northumbria, England, who supposedly died, experienced a powerful vision of heaven, hell, and purgatory, and then was found to be alive. He divided his possessions among his wife and children and made benefices for the poor before becoming a monk at Melrose Abbey. He lived as a hermit there with great austerities. St. Bede gives an account of his life. His feast day is this Wednesday, 17 Aug.

St. Hugh the Little was a martyred **nine year old** of Lincoln, England, reportedly a victim of ritual killing... King Henry III conducted the investigation of the crime which resulted in eighteen or nineteen (people being executed). Hugh had been scourged, crowned with thorns, and crucified. Miracles supposedly accompanied the recovery of the lad's body from a well, and the martyrdom became part of Chaucer's Canterbury Tales. In art, he was depicted bound in cords, kneeling before the Blessed Mother.

Grade II listing protects 'dazzling' Crucifixion mural in closed Catholic Church



Following a long campaign led by SAVE Britain's Heritage, the government has added the 'Oldham Mural' masterpiece to its national heritage register – listed at Grade II.

Titled 'The Crucifixion', the post-WWII mural was completed in 1955 by Hungarian artist George Mayer-Marton and was designed for the Church of the Holy Rosary in Oldham. The church, on the edge of the town, is owned by the Diocese of Salford but closed in 2017 leaving the mural vulnerable to decay and vandalism.

The 7.5m long mural depicts the figure of Christ in golds and tans against a dark blue cross and gold mandorla. It was commissioned following the Festival of Britain when public art came to be seen as a symbol of civic renewal and social progress.

Sophie Andreea, Vice Chair of the Bishops' Conference Patrimony Committee, said:

"The George Mayer-Marton mural in Oldham's Holy Rosary Church is of great importance. The listing recognises this. The Patrimony Committee looks forward to working with Salford Diocese, and all interested parties, to ensure the protection and proper conservation of this outstanding artwork. This is now urgent."
