The Baptism of the Lord

If Baptism washes away our sinfulness and places the Holy Spirit in our hearts , why does Jesus get Baptised in today's Gospel ?

After all He is without sin and He is part of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit is already with Him and in Him—He does not need to receive it?



The Church teaches that Jesus' baptism was His complete acceptance of, and beginning of His mission as God's "suffering Servant". By His act of humility in receiving baptism, Jesus places Himself in amongst the throng of humanity, He joins us in our reality, in our need for forgiveness—He gets in amongst His people, He is showing us that He is our advocate, He is journeying along side us throughout our lives and He is showing us that He is " the Lamb of God who takes away our sins". And through this act of humility, through this willingness to give Himself to the will of God, He is acknowledged by the eternal Father when we hear " this is My Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on Him".

Questions from today's Gospel must include then—are we willing to humble ourselves before God, to accept His will and His call to love and service in our daily lives? Are we willing to embrace the living example of Jesus, when He calls us and His disciples to "come follow me"?

St Vincent de Paul (SVP)


Being a Christian means different things for different people. But at the heart of our calling to faith that we all share, is a call to love God and to love our neighbour.

Do you have an hour to spare either weekly, bi-weekly or monthly to help those who need that support, encouragement , who need the consoling hand of Christ's love?


