Just a thought

Have you noticed how so many people these days are saying that they reject the idea of “organized religion” or alternatively, we hear the phrase “well I am a spiritual person but I don’t agree with the big religions”.

I wonder if, when people are talking of “organized religion” what they really mean is a religion that doesn't “let me do what I want to do and when I want to do it?”.

We do need to remember that the clergy scandals have brought a very real sense of distrust, hurt and caution in many peoples minds for understandable and sad reasons.

Yet todays readings bring to the forefront the challenge that individualism and the dominance of the “its my right” culture has, with the Christian idea of putting the common good of all first, of personal sacrifice and loving our neighbour (Mk 12:31), loving our enemies (Mt 5:44) and forgiving each other (Eph4:32).

Within the modern mindset of the preeminence of rights and freedoms, many in society often seem to forget that with rights come obligations and responsibilities. Todays readings can be seen as a long list of “you must not do the following”, of being told what to do. But as any parent will tell you, sometimes mum and dad know best. Which parent would not tell their child **not to** stick a fork into the electric socket because of what would happen!



Perhaps the lists of “house rules” are in fact acts of love? Acts of love because they help us to live in the image and likeness of God, because God knows what brings true joy, happiness and purpose to our lives. Because God is calling us to be Holy, to be in His presence for eternity. As Paul tells us in our second reading “the wisdom of God, is the wisdom God predestined to be our glory before the ages began”.
