

First Sunday of Lent

In todays readings, on the first Sunday of Lent, we are shown the Lord being tempted by the devil. As we are introduced to the devil, do you notice we are not given the image of a creature portrayed with horns, hooves and breathing fire from his nostrils. We see a subtle, articulate, intellectual individual who tries to use persuasion, Scripture and subtle temptation; asking questions, misrepresenting Scripture and trying to plant seeds of doubt or selfishness into the Lord's mind.



We see a similar reality as we read the book of Job, with the devil referred to as "the opponent", a legal term for someone who represents the prosecution in a trial (we've all herd the phrase—playing devils advocate), one of the reasons we often hear Jesus referred to as our "advocate", the one who is going to plead our cause, our defence council at the day of Judgement.

Just as Jesus is tempted—not threatened, physically wrestled or oppressed, but tempted, this too is the reality within our daily lives. Just as God comes in the quiet winds (2Sam 22:11), in the stillness of the garden (Gen3:8), in the pillar of clouds (Ex13:21), the devil also comes as the nagging suggestion, the encouragement of "go on, your worth it (Mt4:1-11)", or as we read in Genesis when he says to Eve " are you sure God didn't want you to eat the fruit (Gen3:1)?".

So when we think to ourselves—"it wont matter if I don't say my prayers just this once", "if I miss Mass this week because I deserve a Sunday off" or "I cant be bothered to do xyz", it might be worth asking yourself- is this you thinking these things of your own free will or is someone trying to lead you astray?

Just a thought


Have you ever loved someone so much that you would give your life up for them?

This was the thought provoking question we were asked to consider at our Lenten Group last Monday at Tenterden (10.30a.m –12.00 noon each Monday). Replies began to come forward after some consideration—my husband/wife, my children, or my grandchildren.

And yet this was the very sacrifice that our Lord Jesus freely made for each and every one of us. And not just those who were present around Him during His earthly ministry. Jesus gave up His life for all people over all ages of time. It truly is a glorious mystery , unimaginable in its enormity if we truly consider the reality of this choice.

What does this say about our relationship with Jesus ? If we return to our original question “have we ever loved someone so much that we would give up our lives for them” . How must that have felt in our Lord’s heart? How deep, complete , limitless must His love for us truly be?

As we approach the moment each Sunday when we are preparing to receive the Blessed Sacrament, this concept of the Lord’s sacrifice for us and our profession that “ Lord I am not worthy...” leaves me with just one thought— “Lord I am truly, truly not worthy”.
