Pope Francis sends gift for King's Coronation

Pope Francis has sent a relic of the True Cross to His Majesty King Charles III. It has been incorporated into the newly-made Cross of Wales which will lead the Coronation procession at Westminster Abbey next Saturday, (6 May).

The Cross of Wales is a processional cross presented by King Charles III as a centenary gift to the Church in

Wales. The relics, set into the silver cross, are two small wooden splinters from the cross on which Christ was crucified.

Archbishop Mark O'Toole, the Catholic Archbishop of Cardiff and of Menevia, said: "With a sense of deep joy, we embrace this Cross, kindly given by King Charles, and containing a relic of the True Cross, generously gifted by the Holy See. It is not only a sign of the deep Christian roots of our nation but will, I am sure, encourage us all to model our lives in the love given by our Saviour, Jesus Christ".


The Welsh Cross is also inscribed with words from the final sermon of St David in Welsh, saying: "Byddwch lawen. Cadwch y ffydd. Gwnewch y Pethau Bychain," which means in English: "Be joyful. Keep the faith. Do the little things."

Building on the teachings within Pope Francis encyclical *Fratelli Tutti* the Bishops remind us "Scripture tells us: "Love the stranger then, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt" (Deuteronomy 10:19). The word 'stranger' is variously translated as 'foreigner', 'immigrant', 'sojourner' or 'alien'. However, the message remains consistent: those arriving from other parts of the world are our sisters and brothers. We are called to see Christ in them, for all people are created in His image. And we are called to see ourselves in them, for we all share this common humanity."
