Today's reading is so relevant for the challenges that our world faces today. With war raging in the Ukraine, the Holy Land, much of sub-Saharan Africa and tensions building across the Arabian peninsula within the far east. We are seeing many millions of people fleeing war, drought, floods, natural disasters, modern slavery and oppression. The root cause of these challenges, the reality of individual or national greed. 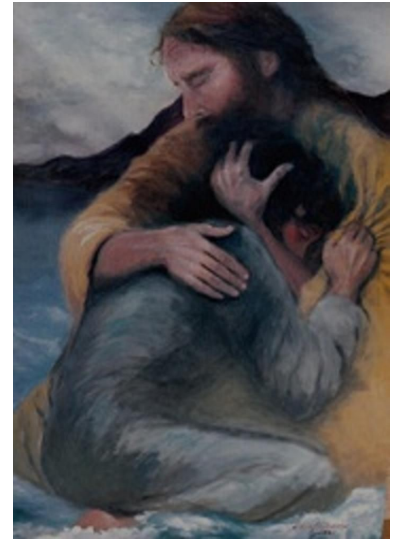
