As every good scout will tell you—"Be prepared"

Today the Lord reminds us that none of us know when He will return, or when our own time on earth is ended, and as such we should be always live our lives in a state of readiness.

In today's parable, the lamp is our body, our life which is given to us by God and our prayer or time given to God is the oil. Prayer builds up our 'supply of oil', but there is a purpose or an active outcome of the lamp and the oil coming together, and that outcome is to provide light. And the purpose of the light, so that people might see.

The light we bring, the active outputs of embracing our God given life and the fuel from our prayers, is the burning flame of our good works that we do in the name of Jesus. And by doing these acts of love, charity and sharing of the faith, we demonstrate that we are the "attentive bridesmaids", waiting for the return of the bridegroom—Jesus Christ.

In the book of Ecclesiastes we read that there is a time for all things (Ecc 3:1). Today this is brought into sharp focus as we are shown that there is a time for preparation (prayer) and a time for action (works).
