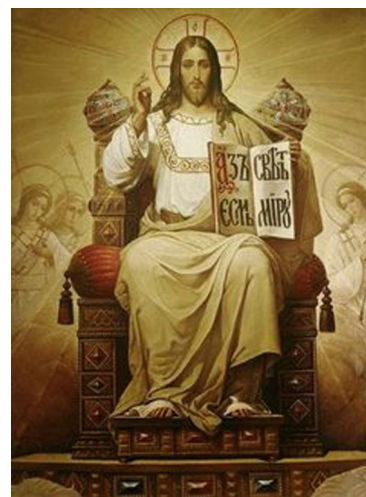
Christ Our King.

As we come to the end of 2023, we can see a world that is just as in need of Christ as it's Sovereign and leader as it ever has done.

The celebration of Christ the King was only introduced formally into the Church calendar as a Solemnity in 1925 by Pope Pius XI. Partly in response to the atrocities of the first World War and the ongoing political strife that was ongoing. Something we see globally to this day with the greed, aggression, nationalism and the squeezing of the poor for the benefit of the wealthy.

Jesus came to humanity as the ultimate sign of God's love for all mankind, to show us the path to our salvation through working together for the benefit of all, reaching out to those on the fringes of society and the poor and treating everyone with the dignity that is due to all God's children. All reasons why the Temple authorities rejected Him as the Messiah.

The Gospels are a glorious message of hope and of liberation for us all. They remind us repeatedly not to put our trust and hope in the worldly (Mt 6:19) nor in man's philosophy (Ps 118:8) but to look to God, to see God, by seeing the Son and placing our trust and hope in the liberation from sin and earthliness that comes from Jesus Christ—our King, our teacher, our brother and our friend.
