During lockdown, one of the changes to health care provision that the government put in place was the “service” for women to order the morning after pill on line and have it sent through to their home address without any consultation with a health care professional.

The sad reality of this is that it has put both the woman's health at risk and more sadly there has become a major issue with babies being aborted after the 24 week timescale.

Baby Lily was one such example, when her mother ordered the morning after pill when she was 32 weeks pregnant. She took the tablet and the baby died. Her mother was subsequently sent to jail for “an illegal termination”.

SPUC are focusing there efforts in trying to get this “service” cancelled due to its all round risk to all involved .
