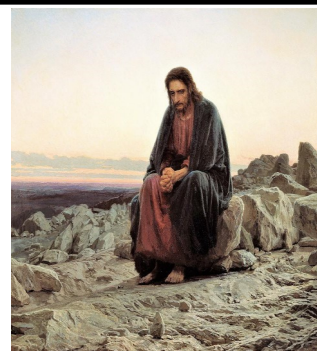
Tempted? Jesus understands.

It is a stark reality, but we face the allure of the world and of the devil every day. Beginning with the story of Adam and Eve in the Garden, Jacob, his brother and a bowl of soup, Samson and the lust of sex, Jonah rejecting God's call et al, temptation has and is an eternal challenge in its truest sense. Sadly, all too often we want to be God like and we always want more! Jesus experienced the same temptation of worldly glamour while in the wilderness but it was His faith and understanding of what is truly important in life that gave Him the strength to bring Him through these temptations unscathed.

The Biblical meaning of the word "temptation" is "a trial in which people have a free choice of being faithful or unfaithful to God". Satan tried to encourage Jesus to deviate from His Father's plan by misusing the gifts and authority He had been given—just as the devil tries to tempt us with the subtle encouragement to "reject God and become God" - the devil's eternal mantra.



Our culture tells us that to be happy we need to fill our lives with more and more "stuff"—but as Jesus warns us, "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Mt6:21), the consumerist machine needs our voracious appetites to buy more, to want more and to put our own needs ahead of everyone else's. Everything which is in reality, counter to the Gospel message of loving our neighbour and loving God and just temptation.



Just a thought....

Our Lenten sacrifice is a sign of our love for our heavenly Father and a humble demonstration of our willingness to give something important up, or that we rely on, to break that addiction to worldly things, allowing us to embrace our true hearts desire of heavenly peace in the presence of God.

And if we trip or fall, our Lord is there alongside us, waiting to catch us and to help us back up. Just as Simon of Cyrene does as Christ carries His Cross and stumbles.
