"You are my beloved"

In today's Gospel we hear God repeating the words that He spoke at the Baptism of our Lord—"this is my Son, the Beloved". These words are a beautiful and loving outpouring of a father for his son. But they are also the words God says to each and every one of us. Through our baptism we are the brothers and sisters of Christ. The Holy Spirit dwells in each of our hearts—equally. God made us and gave us the precious gift of faith. We—you are God's beloved child.

And yet this is something that so many of us struggle with as a statement of faith. This is where the genuine outpouring of God's love becomes a challenging reality for our hearts to believe and our mind's to comprehend. Firstly, do we embrace and believe that we are, individually the beloved child of God? If we need further affirmation, we need only reflect on the message of the prodigal son to see the welcome that awaits us all as we accept this reality. And secondly do we embrace and believe that those around us are also the beloved children of God? Is this fact reflected in how we relate to the people around us? Do we really see them as God's beloved too?

The more we are able to embrace this message, the more we are able to fulfil Christ's call to love our neighbour as our self—because our neighbour—who is also God's beloved child, is equally entitled to His love as we are. Embracing this truth, we are brought to the words of St Paul this week—"who are we to judge?" And "if God is for us, who can be against us?"



Just a thought....

Today's reading from Romans (8:31-34) is an awesome (in its truest sense) statement of God's love for us all.

Why not spend some time in prayer and reflection on this reading through the week—

"Who Can Separate us from the Love of Christ? What then can we say in response to all this? If God is for us, who can be against us? He did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for all of us. How then can he fail also to give us everything else along with him?

Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who acquits. Who will condemn? Christ Jesus, who died, or rather rose again, who is at God's right hand and intercedes for us?"
