There will only be one Easter Sunday Mass at 10.00a.m. This is a glorious opportunity for our whole community to come together to celebrate the Rising of the Lord.

Father Max will be offering the Sacrament of Reconciliation after each of the Masses through the week.

Song of the Suffering Servant

Today's first reading introduces us to the reality of the life experience of our Lord, in the "Song of the Suffering Servant".

In the Book of Isaiah, we are given the four "Songs of the Servant" that describe the service, suffering, and exaltation of the Servant of the Lord, who is the Messiah. The Servant Songs can be found in Isaiah 42:1–9; Isaiah 49:1–13; Isaiah 50:4–11; and Isaiah 52:13–53:12.

All four "songs" show the Messiah to be God's meek and gentle Servant. He is a royal figure, representing Israel in its ideal form; He is the high priest, atoning for the sins of the world. Isaiah predicts that this Servant of the Lord will deliver the world from the prison of sin, but not without much personal suffering and sacrifice on His part.

In the royal terminology of the ancient Near East, a servant was a "trusted envoy," a "confidential representative," or "one who is chosen."

The contrast of Isaiah's suffering servant is not lost when seen in parallel with the Gospel narrative of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Over the coming journey of Holy week we are shown the sad reality that we all must face in our own faith journey. Joyously welcoming the coming of our saviour and God's chosen one on Palm Sunday and the dark contrast of the crowd baying for Christ to be Crucified—all within the short period of two days. The entry of the King of Kings contrasted with the rejection and humiliation on the criminals cross.

Oh suffering servant—forgive us our weakness and help us to love you more fully and deepen our faith this Pascal Season. Amen

As we enter into Holy Week and the Lord's journey from triumphal entry into Jerusalem, to betrayal at the last supper, His arrest, conviction, execution and triumphant rising again in glory, how can we explain what this week means to us, to our friends, family, colleagues and neighbours?

Is there someone who I can bring to the Easter Triduum this week?

After all Christ died for us all and the salvation of all humanity and didn't He suggest to the bystander "come and see"?
