Pentecost—The Gift of the Spirit.

The words of today's second Reading are some of my favourite within sacred Scripture because they help us to understand in our hearts, what it means to be Christian. Paul writes about the gifts that the Holy Spirit bring to our lives **"what the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self control."** - all capturing the essence of Christ's Ministry here on earth—all of which are the opposite of the scourge of selfishness—which Paul sees as the biggest temptation that we face in our daily lives.



The first of the gifts of the Holy Spirit is love, something that has been pre-eminent in the readings over the last three weeks as we journey to Pentecost. And yet love has become such a confused concept in today's world—love has become interchangeable with the word "lust" in our modern language which loses the Christian meaning. Christ came to show us that love is about personal sacrifice for others.

True "love" is about putting the needs of the other before our own. It's about a genuine giving of self. God gave His Son to teach and show us the way to eternity in love. God gave His Son to the point of death for our Salvation in love, and now at Pentecost God gives His Holy Spirit to work within us so that we might become more Christ like and share the gifts of the Holy Spirit with those around us—the gifts of **love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self control.**

Just a thought...

What works does the Holy Spirit need to do in your heart this Pentecost and for the year ahead?

Loving God, whenever it may become my duty to make a choice, be my light and my counsel, and mercifully make the way known to me that I should follow. Preserve me from listening to the suggestions of my own selfish desires, or worldly influence, giving preference to your guidance and will. Let your good Spirit lead me into the right way, and let your providence place me, not where I may naturally feel inclined to go, but where all things may be most conducive to your glory and to the good of my soul. Adoration and Benediction Each Month

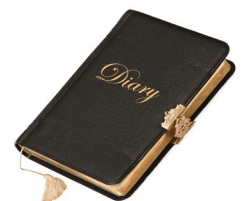
