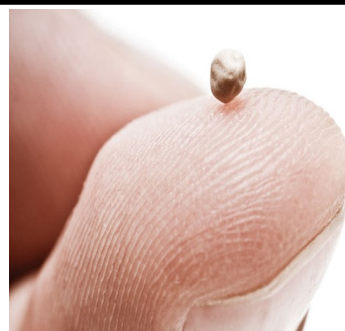

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

To bring us to a prayerful readiness to receive and welcome the Lord into our hearts at Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will Exposed for the 30 minutes prior to celebration of the Eucharist each Sunday.

The Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed

The parable of the seed and the mustard seed are so simple that it is easy to overlook their deep significance for our daily lives. The message is the importance of growth. The message of the seed speaks of the Kingdom's gradual development in our hearts and our lives, while the mustard seed shows us the disproportion between the first stages of faith and the overwhelming glory of the final stages and the flourishing of God's grace in our lives.—the seed to the bush.



But we must not forget, that for a seed to flourish it must be planted in good soil, it must receive the nurturing of light and warmth and it must be nourished by the gift of the rain . And this is equally true of our spiritual life and growth. We receive nourishment from the Eucharist, we receive God's light through our prayer life and reading Scripture and the soil of our heart is prepared through Mother Church and the formation encouragement and affirmation of our Parish family.

Through this nourishment and nurturing the seed of God's kingdom begins to bear fruit in our hearts through our good deeds, and works, and as these mature they become fit for the harvest that is the promise of eternal life in God's presence.

Today's opening prayer (the Collect), captures so beautifully what we hope for through our faith journey—a faith that grows throughout our life like the mustard seed.

Why not spend time this week reflecting on today's opening prayer and listen for the gentle voice of God in your busy week ahead.
