Jesus gives us the authority of love and forgiveness

One of the most challenging and let's be honest, scary aspects of our life as a Christian is thinking about the call we all receive, to go out into the world with the "message" of Jesus Christ, and to follow the examples of the Apostles in today's Gospel.



But the call to us all is not necessarily about preaching from Scripture, talking about the Catechism or even pointing out the mistakes people are making in their own lives. While some are called to preach, some are called to minister to the sick, some to religious life and others to married or single life, mum, dad, granny or grandad, whatever vocation we are called to live out, the commonality in them all, is love and forgiveness. 
