Did you know.....

Today's Gospel talks about the controversy that Jesus created when He referred to Himself as "the bread from heaven".

The obvious connection here is to the Eucharist itself and receiving the very body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus at the altar each Sunday. But did you know that we receive bread twice at every Mass. During the Liturgy of the Word, the first half of the celebration of Mass—we receive the bread that is the Word of God via the readings from Scripture and the Psalm. While in the second part we receive the very body of Christ.

The Liturgy (meaning communal prayer) of the Word, also acts as a type of baptism, as it washes away the worries, focus, challenges of our daily lives that we bring with us to Church, and prepares us in our thoughts and hearts to receive the true manna from Heaven.

Each Mass nourishes us intellectually, emotionally, and spiritually, when we approach in faith. Because without the eyes of faith, Jesus becomes simply the "son of Mary and Joseph" that the complaining Jews refer to in today's Gospel.

A message from Bishop Richard.

Violent anti-immigration protests have erupted across the UK, with demonstrations taking place in a number of towns and cities including Bristol, Leicester, London, Liverpool, Birmingham, Plymouth and Belfast.

The Catholic Church teaches that we are one human family, that every person is made in the image and likeness of God, and that all human life is sacred. Speaking earlier today, Bishop Richard said:

“The violent demonstrations we are witnessing at this time are a cause of immense distress and concern to us all. A violent approach will increase tension, fear and resentment for all in our communities at a time when we should seek reconciliation and understanding.

Just a thought...

“I urge then, first of all, that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all those who hold positions of authority, so that we may be able to lead a tranquil and quiet life with all possible devotion and dignity. To do so is right and acceptable to God our Saviour, **who desires everyone to be saved and to come to full knowledge of the truth.**

For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and man, Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for **all**. “ 1 Timothy 2:1-6.
