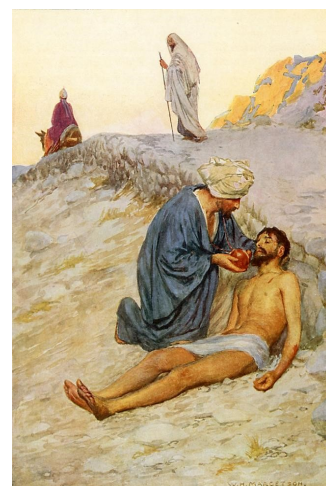
Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. (Phil4:6)

Worldly or eternal?

In the book of Wisdom we are reminded of the vast disparity between worldly thinking and God's Wisdom, a subject further enforced through our Gospel reading today and Jesus' affirmation of the risk of stubbornness in our hearts. It is also something we are currently experiencing in the UK as we face the possibility of assisted suicide being legalised.

God's Wisdom calls us to embrace the dignity of life created in His image, along with the primacy of showing our love and care for the poor, the sick and the elderly. We are also called to remember that when we are making choices in the world we should always remember the common good and the impact we have on the wider community.

To understand the Church's teaching on the care for the critically and terminally ill and God's affirming love for all, it is encouraged that we read the Vatican booklet entitled "*Samaritanus bonus*" or "the good Samaritan". This can be found on the Vatican website . It is especially recommended for all healthcare professionals and those who are supporting and caring for the seriously ill .

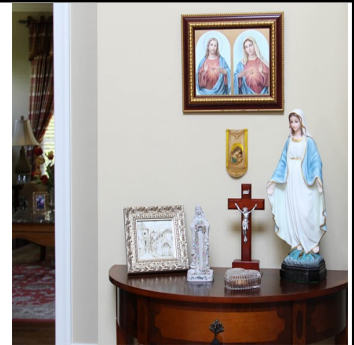
Just a thought...

On the 29th October, the Diocese of England and Wales are gathering together to explore - *"Nurturing the domestic Church: Encouraging the growth of family spirituality in the home"*.
