Give from the heart

In our Gospel today, we see the stark contrast between the dignitaries of the Temple, parading in their splendour, and the absolute poverty of the widow. And yet Jesus sees the small gift that she makes from her heart, rather than the lavish wealth, pomp and glitter that surrounds Him in the temple.

These little coins were called "lepta" in Greek, meaning 'light', little more than shavings of copper, hardly worth picking up if you saw them on the ground. Yet as we all know, the value of a gift depends not on its absolute worth, but in the love with which it is given.

You can imagine the widow debating with herself: could she survive without these two little coins, if she made this supreme gift to the Lord. What would she have to go without? This paltry gift, is a rich expression of her trust in God's love and care, of her wanting to do something for the Lord. The little gift would go unnoticed among the riches of that exquisite and lavish temple, but it was a heartfelt expression of her love. And it is just the same with our prayers—a small heartfelt prayer of thanks, hope or love are worth so much more in the eyes of God that empty, hollow words.

Wednesday 13th November—National Prayer event for Human Dignity

Cardinal Vincent Nichols has called for Catholics in England and Wales to join him, and the Bishops of our countries, to pause for an hour at **5:30pm on Wednesday, 13 November** to pray for the dignity of human life. On that day, the Bishops will pause for an hour in the middle of their autumn plenary meeting to kneel in front of the Blessed Sacrament for a holy hour in light of the bill passing through the UK parliament that seeks to legalise assisted suicide. The bill, is due to have its Second Reading with a vote, on Friday, 29 November 2024.

From the Bishops website— “We offer our prayers this holy hour for the dignity of human life,” said Cardinal Nichols. “In particular our focus is on the end of life and praying together in front of the Blessed Sacrament that assisted suicide will not become law in our lands. This would greatly diminish the importance and innate value of every human person, akin to saying that our life is *not* a gift of God. Instead we would be asserting that life is our own possession to do with as we choose. But we are far more important than that. We are a gift of God – a gift that is freely given. Then, when God is ready, we are called back to Him.”

From Pope Francis' Encyclical on the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

(18). “in the heart of each person there is a mysterious connection between self-knowledge and openness to others, between the encounter with one’s personal uniqueness and the willingness to give oneself to others. We become ourselves only to the extent that we acquire the ability to acknowledge others, while only those who can acknowledge and accept themselves are then able to encounter others.”

Pope Francis is telling us that we only become our true self as we learn to love our neighbour, because our true self is found in the image of Christ, so learning to love is learning to be like Christ.
