

The meaning of life

The book of Daniel was written during the time of the Babylonian exile. It was bringing the people hope through God's revelation to them. Daniel is revealing to them, that even though they are experiencing tough, challenging and worrying times, God is with them in every trial. Also, that despite all the uncertainty and unfairness of life, God's promise of an eternity in glory is waiting for them—is waiting for us.

This message is further reinforced by Christ in today's Gospel reading. Jesus is telling us about the end of days when He will return to gather all the faithful to Him and, just as He will later rise, body and soul, we too will join Him physically and spiritually in heaven. But Christ brings a warning with Him; that throughout the journey of life and our own free will, we must account for our choices. However, here we are truly blessed in the advocacy of Christ. As we are told in the book of Hebrews, Jesus "sanctifies us and forgives all sins", if we turn to Him in contrition and humility.

As we come towards the end of the Church year and the celebration of Christ the King next week, it's brings us an opportunity to reflect back on the year and to consider the choices we have made. As we learn from life's ups and downs, good and bad, we can grow in faith and hope, because Christ is thee for us.

A new translation of Sacred Scripture

From Sunday 1st December you may notice a few subtle changes to some of the readings at Mass. This is because there is a new translation of the Scriptures being used by the Roman Catholic Church in England and Wales and we will be reading from a new Lectionary, which was last updated in 2011.



The aim of the new translation is to bring us ever closer to the original meaning and intentions of the inspired word of God. It is not a "rewriting" but an updated translation of the original texts. To explain in more detail there is a leaflet published by the Catholic Truth Society available for everyone, so do please take a copy to read at your leisure.

Please be assured that the Mass, the order of readings, and the teaching of the Church are completely unaffected.
