Christ is coming.

Every Advent, the two middle Sunday's centre on the work of John the Baptist. But why did God send John the Baptist to "prepare a way for the Lord"? (Is 40:3-5)

The reality is that to truly embrace the gift of the coming Messiah, God knew that the human hearts needed a radical change in attitude. The first step to being able to hear the call of hope and love from Christ, was the washing away of the noise and clamour of our worldly sinfulness, through the soul cleansing gift of baptism. Sin weighs us down and brings our thoughts and minds down from the glory of God and into the world. And this is the message from the prophet Baruch in our first reading, as we are told to "take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction (our sin)... put on forever the beauty of the glory of God."

God is constantly bringing us the route map, to draw us into His presence—He sends the prophets to lead us to the right path, He forgives all those who ask, and He sends His only begotten Son to accomplish our salvation. And He tries to make things easy for us too with "valleys filled" and challenges removed. The only step we need to take? Turning to Him and saying "God I love you" with "a humble and repentant heart" (Ps50).

“My sacrifice is a humble spirit, O God; you will not reject a humble and repentant heart.” (Ps 50:17)



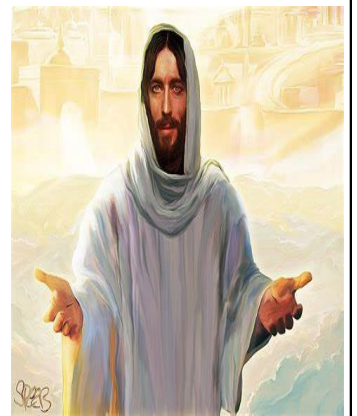
Going to Confession in Advent
