All are needed, all are special in God's Kingdom.

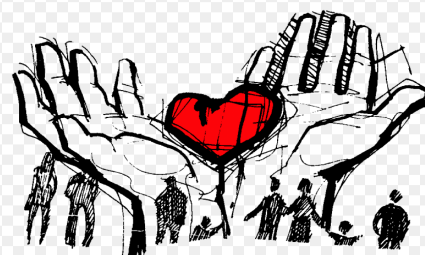
This weekend we are brought a wonderful message of love and inclusion for all.

Nehemiah was calling those returning to Isreal at the end of the Babylonian exile to return to God and the Jewish way of life; embracing God's teachings and come back together again as a community, united in God's wisdom.

In a similar way, St Paul's letter to the Corinthians, graphically and passionately reminds each and every one of us, that we all have an important and personal purpose to fulfil within the community of both the Parish and the universal reality that is God's Kingdom and that we are all called to communion with God and with each other.

This message of unity, common purpose and the call for the common good, is again brought before us in the opening chapters of Luke's Gospel. Addressed to "Theophilus" – this is a name which is often translated as "lover of God". And yet this translation is oversimplified in our modern language. "Theos" rightly translates as "God"; however, "philia" is more than just "love". It is the special type of love experienced between family and close friends; Luke's Gospel is addressed to all who have an intimate and special familial love with God.

God draws us all together so that using our unique and God given gifts and charisms we might serve Him through serving our community and loving each other as family. Afterall, His Sons shows us the gift of sacrifice for others founded in love for all.
