Pressing in to hear the Word of God.

What a marvellous and evocative turn of phrase we receive today. So enamoured with Christ's presence, the crowd were doing all they could to hear from the lips of Jesus, "pressing in to hear the Word of God".

This reminds me of a scene I had the privilege to witness at the Wintershall event last year when the life of Christ was re-enacted to school children, in the beautiful countryside of Surrey. The scene being portrayed was the distribution of the loaves and fishes to the crowds. There must have been around 200+ school children of mixed ages present and as the actor playing Jesus moved to the front of the crowd, there came a clamoring and calling, waving of arms and hands throughout the whole crowd, all calling out to the image of Christ, asking to receive the bread as they all called out "over here, over here, to me, to me, give me your bread!".

In both scenes, from the Gospel and the modern day portrayal, the longing, yearning and desire to receive the Word of God is palpable, whether in the person of Christ, or the revealed Word of God that is Scripture, we are reminded of the longing and desire in our hearts that draws us each time, as we come toward the Eucharistic table.

And yet as with all relationships, there is always the risk of complacency or distraction. Properly preparing ourselves for the gift of Christ's very body and blood, which we receive each time we come to Mass, remains such an important aspect of our Eucharistic pilgrimage. Properly prepared in our own hearts, we too can press to hear the Word of God and experience the longing and clamour in our souls to receive the Bread of Life.

With this ambition in mind, the Church has been called to start this building of awareness “Marriage Week” which is running from 7-14 February.

Pope Francis : Nothing is more important than a Child

“Nothing is worth more than the life of a child.” Addressing world leaders convened in the Vatican for the first global Summit on Children’s Rights on Monday, Pope Francis reiterated his impassioned plea for the protection of children who are victims of conflict, poverty, migration and of a “throwaway culture”, including abortion and neglect, and insisted on the urgent need to listen to them.



“Love Them and Protect Them” is the theme of the event at which panellists hailing from across the world are discussing children’s protection from violence and exploitation, with access to resources, access to education and health, and their rights to a family.
