
Trust the past to the mercy of God, the present to His love, and the future to His providence. St Augustine

There are no limits to God's mercy and love.

As Pope Francis is laid to rest, we remember the message that was so firmly embedded at the heart of his Ministry and life, the message reminding us of the love and forgiveness of Christ for all.

Again and again, Pope Francis drew us back to the Gospel message of hope for the poor, the refugee, and those rejected by the world. In his encyclical *Fratelli Tutti (Brothers and sisters all)* he challenged the strong nations to be compassionate to the weak, the rich to encourage and share with the poor. In *Amoris Laetitia (the Joy of Love)* we are called to seek to understand the hurt, the isolated, the lonely, not to judge them or look down on them, but to bring the consolation of Christ to those who need it the most. While in *Evangeli Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel)* Pope Francis asks us to open our heart's to the joy and love that is found in every word of the Gospel and in the Easter promise.

This Divine Mercy Sunday the message is again reinforced—that God does not see or judge as the world judges or see's, rather, God sees the heart of all His children and shows His unconditional love for us all. God cares for all His children from every walk of life. Jesus is calling us, challenging us, to love God and to love our neighbour in a Christ-like way, not an earthly way.
